About St Ives

Starting life as a small, fishing village St Ives became the international centre of the modern art world in the 1950s. Characterised by spectacular, sandy beaches and tiny, cobbled streets St Ives is both beautiful and historically important.

Home to Tate St Ives, Barbara Hepworth Museum & Sculpture Garden and Leach Pottery St Ives retains its vitally important place in the art world; at the same time it's home to world class surfers and the epicentre of some of Cornwall's most spectacular and challenging sporting activities.

St Ives is flanked by four beaches and miles of stunning coast path. It is small enough to feel safe and large enough to create an action packed trip.

Location & Transport

St Ives is situated on the North coast of Cornwall. It has its own train station, bus station, coach park and the nearest airport (Newquay) is just a 45 minute drive away. It's a 5 hour train journey from London Paddington Station or a short flight from London Heathrow Airport. It is also possible to fly into Newquay from regional airports in the UK and Europe including Edinburgh, Dublin, Newcastle and York.

Surrounds

St Ives is a great place to base yourself to explore West Cornwall. It's within easy reach of iconic sites such as the Eden Project and Tintagel Castle as well as being a short drive to Lands End, the Minack Theatre and St Michael's Mount.

Inspire your students in St Ives

In the 1950s St Ives was the international centre of the modern art world. A sleepy little fishing town had the art world's eyes on it due to its powerful associations with world famous figures such as Barbara Hepworth, Alfred Wallis and many others who made St Ives their home.

Turner, Whistler and Sickert were drawn here in the 19th century by the dramatic landscape and brilliant light, and age hasn't reduced St Ives' allure. Ramshackle fishermen's cottages jostle for space with galleries and artists' studios, crowned by our very own, newly refurbished, Tate Gallery.

Whatever art discipline your focus is you'll find a workshop or activity to test your students' abilities, challenge their thinking and enhance their techniques.

Rooms & Pod beds


Cohort Hostel has both dorms and private rooms; all our dorm rooms have pod beds which are handmade to fit our different sized rooms. Each bed has its own privacy curtain, light, USB port and plug socket along with lockable, under-bed storage.

Private rooms are ideal for single or twin occupancy and have hand basins in the room.

All beds are furnished with crisp, white linen; towels and additional pillows are available to hire from reception.

Shower blocks

There are 3 spotlessly clean shower blocks at Cohort Hostel – male, female and unisex. All have good sized toilet and shower cubicles and plenty of space. All bedrooms – both private and dorms are situated close to these shower blocks.



Capacity & Layout

Cohort Hostel can accommodate up to 60 people in the following configuration:

- 7 x 6 bed dorms
- 1 x 8 bed dorm
- 1 x 4 bed dorm
- 3 x twin, private rooms

Access

The majority of the accommodation is on the first floor near to the lounge and single sex facilities. There are 3 bedrooms situated on the ground floor near to the unisex facilities and kitchen.





All food at Cohort is optional and there is a self-catering kitchen for you to do your own thing if you wish. Alternatively, if you'd like to take advantage of what we offer you can choose from just breakfast all the way through to full board; or mix and match to suit your itinerary.

All dietary requirements can be catered for.



Breakfast £1.75 per person per day*

Help yourself to: Assortment of cereals, milk, toast, jams / marmalade, tea, coffee, fruit juice.

Your breakfast is kept in the kitchen for you to help yourself to in the mornings: your group will also have a dedicated area of the fridge.

Packed lunch £3.80 per person per day*

We use local, Cornish suppliers for our packed lunches and each lunch consists of a sandwich, Cornish pasty or a wrap, a packet of crisps and a piece of fruit.

All sandwiches and pasties are pre-selected by you a few weeks before the trip.
